New Quick Charts widget lets you run saved Quick Charts on Pages	A page administrator can configure the new Quick Charts widget to appear on a Page. Then, members associated with the Page can run saved Quick Charts in the widget.

Review graduation requirements for a group of students	School administrators can now review their students' progress toward fulfilling graduation requirements as a group. From the new Graduation History side-tab, select a program of study to see notes, total credits gained and completed status codes for each top-level requirement for the program of study. Filter the data by program of study requirement, completed status code and grade level.

Priority 1 is the highest. (Student or Family portal, My Info > Requests)

New Gradebook preference automatically applies assignments to linked class sections	The Gradebook preference, Add Assignments Add to all linked classes by default (Staff view, click your user name on the settings bar > Set preferences > Gradebook tab), determines whether an assignment you create for a class is automatically added to all linked class sections. This preference is enabled by default. If you disable the preference and then create an assignment for a class with linked sections, you will have to manually select the checkboxes next to the section(s) you want this assignment to apply to.	
Homeroom teachers can use a seating chart to take homeroom (daily) attendance	The Seating Chart side-tab now appears in the Staff view under the Daily side-tab (Attendance > Daily). It shows a seating chart similar to the one displayed in the Staff view, Attendance > Class > Seating Chart . Teachers with two homerooms can select the room from a Homeroom drop-down at the top of the page.

	When a teacher selects the Standards view on the Gradebook Scores page, the Add Assignment , Update Post Columns and Post buttons now appear, depending on their selection in the Standard field.		
Add Assignment, Update Post Columns and Post buttons now appear on Scores page in Gradebook's Standards view	When Standard is set to Post Columns - Term or Post Columns - Average , the Update Post Columns and Post Grades buttons appear. When Standard is set to a category, the Add Assignment button appears. When Standard is set to Averages or Trends , Update Post Columns appears, if the posting window is open
